# Summary of Workshop Content

## Session 1: Defining Evidence-Based Prevention Programs

Evidence-based programs are those that have been rigorously evaluated and proven effective at changing sexual risk-taking behavior. During this workshop we will discuss the characteristics of and components that define an evidence-based program teen pregnancy prevention program.

## Sessions 2 and 3: Evidence-Based Program Characteristics and Effective Implementation

Understanding evidence-based programs will lead to a thoughtful and deliberate selection of the most appropriate teen pregnancy prevention program for the population of youth being served. Implementing a program with fidelity is critical to achieving the expected program outcomes. During this workshop we will explore the use of a logic model and define the risk and protective factors that influence sexual risk-taking behavior. These activities will help participants better assess their community needs, review selected curricula and select the most appropriate evidence-based teen pregnancy prevention program.

## Session 4: Potential Sources of Teen Pregnancy Prevention Funding

Funding for teen pregnancy prevention is expected to be available from federal government sources in mid to late 2010. Requests for proposals (RFPs) may be released as soon as April 2010. Identifying the potential sources of these funds and the expected use of these funds will be discussed during this workshop.
